#### Respectful Communication:

We were disappointed to encounter an abusive phone call this week. To maintain a positive environment, staff have been instructed to terminate calls with inappropriate language. Please treat each other with respect and understanding. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### Non-Uniform Day for Shelter:

In the spirit of giving, we will have a non-uniform day on Friday, 15th December, to raise money for Shelter; your support is greatly appreciated.

#### Gate and Toilet Access Information:

Please take note of the gate opening times and access points, especially during the morning and afternoon rush. The caretakers and SLT duty staff are working to ensure a smooth flow for our students. Higham Lane Gate and the inner gate by Reception are open at 8.15am until 8.39am. Students who enter the site before 8.15am to use the library (which is open from 8am) will need to enter through Brookdale Gate. Staff can still use the inner vehicle gate by reception using their lanyards. The toilets by resources will be open for all students to use before school from 8.30am. Higham Lane Gate, the inner vehicle gate by Reception and the Student Services vehicle gate will all open at 3.15pm to 3.25pm. Students who leave lessons early to avoid the crowded corridors will need to leave via Reception. There is no vehicular access to the site between 3.10pm and 3.25pm. The caretakers will move barriers into place at 3.10pm and the SLT duty staff on Shanklin and Brookdale will then remove these at 3.25pm.

#### Bikeability Scheme - Years 7 - 9

Thanks to funding from Warwickshire County Council we are offering a free Bikeability Level 3 course in Nuneaton. For more information and details of how to book, please visit <a href="https://outspokentraining.co.uk/holiday-courses/">https://outspokentraining.co.uk/holiday-courses/</a>.

Our Bikeability Level 3 course is intended for children in school years 6 – 9 who have previously completed the Bikeability Level 1 & 2 course. All courses are run by first aid and safeguarding trained National Standard Instructors. The session is 3 hours long. Level 3 equips riders with the skills to tackle more complex roads and traffic situations such as roundabouts and junctions controlled by traffic lights. The training also includes guidance and practice on planning routes.
