## Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

The HAF programme, funded by the Department for Education, supports school-aged children in full-time education from Reception to Year 11 (inclusive) who receive benefits-related free school meals. This programme offers valuable support to families on lower incomes, providing young people with access to activities and healthy meals during the main school holidays at Christmas, Easter, and Summer.

For our upcoming Summer provision over the school summer holidays, each eligible young person with a Warwickshire HAF code can access a maximum of 16 funded sessions, all of which include a meal.
