We are also excited for the new food menus to come into place, which will start when we return after the October half-term break. Those of you who attended the Year 6 into Year 7 Open Evening last week were treated to a showcase of some of the fantastic new menu food that was on display in the canteen that is coming to HLS!

Year 6 Applications Reminder

For anyone with children in Year 6 and wanting to apply for a school place, this is a reminder that the deadline for applications is 31st October. Applications can only be made through the Warwickshire Parent Portal. As you will know, Higham Lane School is an oversubscribed school, and we are very proud to be the only Ofsted Outstanding school in Nuneaton. We are also very proud to have both the best GCSE results and the best A-level results of any school in our locality.

If you wish for your child to come to our school, we strongly advise that you select schools for all six options on the form and that you choose Higham Lane School as your first choice. A reminder that if you are unsuccessful with a school, it does not disadvantage you in any way with any lower down options; you simply move down to your second choice, and so on. As a result, parents often choose Higham Lane School as their first choice in the hope of gaining a place, and we would strongly encourage you to do the same again this year. Please also remember that if you have an older child, then under the sibling rule, you stand an excellent chance of gaining a place at our school.
