We currently deliver comprehensive lessons on healthy relationships, consent, misogyny and equality and much more. We also invest in external expertise, such as theatre groups such as Loudmouth and the organisation Safeline to deliver expert sessions on domestic abuse and consent amongst other important topics. When the Lead Ofsted Inspector visited us in May, he was extremely impressed, not only by the content of these sessions and the quality of our personal development curriculum, but also by the mature and thoughtful way our students engaged with them. We will continue to ensure our curriculum supports our students to be the best that they can be not just in the classroom in academic subjects, but also be prepared to be outstanding citizens in society.
