# INVICTUS

**Invictus** (meaning “unconquerable” or “undefeated” in Latin) is a poem which focuses on the human spirit and its ability to overcome adversity. It is a rallying cry for those who find themselves in challenging and trying situations, who have to dig deep and fight the demands of each day. The poet certainly knew hard times and needed all his strength to battle against disease.

Born in Gloucester, England in 1849, he was diagnosed with tubercular arthritis at the age of 12 and went through years of pain and discomfort. Henley wrote *Invictus* whilst in hospital undergoing treatment for tuberculosis of the bones, specifically those in his left leg, which had to be amputated from the knee down. He was still only a young man at this time.

*Invictus* does contain passion and defiance and it is easy to see just why so many use the powerful lines to drum up courage and to shed light in difficult times.

## Did you know?

- In a speech to the House of Commons on 9 September 1941, Winston Churchill paraphrased the last two lines of the poem, stating “We are still masters of our fate. We still are captains of our souls.”
- Nelson Mandela, while incarcerated at Robben Island prison, recited the poem to other prisoners and was empowered by its message of self-mastery.
- The poem's last stanza was quoted by US President Barack Obama at the end of his speech at Nelson Mandela's memorial service (10 December 2013) in South Africa
- The *Invictus* Games; an international Paralympic multi-sport event created by Prince Harry in which wounded, injured or sick armed services personnel and their associated veterans take part in sport, has featured the poem in its promotions. Prior to the inaugural games in London in 2014, entertainers including Daniel Craig and Tom Hardy, and athletes including Louis Smith and Iwan Thomas, read the poem in a promotional video.
- The poem was recited in an early commercial for the Microsoft Xbox One.
- It was during his time in Edinburgh that Henley met the writer Robert Louis Stevenson. They became friends and corresponded on a regular basis. Stevenson later admitted that he had based his character Long John Silver - from the book *Treasure Island* - on Henley, he having a wooden leg, a strong rasping voice and a forceful personality.

This poem hangs in a frame opposite my office desk in the sixth form. It was given to me a good friend and has since provided me with much strength in good and challenging times. ## How does this poem relate to you?




